Father Gerry's Homily:

'We are all witnesses to the resurrection of Jesus'

Last Sunday the Gospel was about a doubting Thomas. Today we have two disciples on the road to Emmaus, confused and looking for answers. Their main question is how could it be that their master, Jesus of Nazareth, a prophet mighty in word and deed, could be put to death. For them, He really seemed to be the long-awaited Messiah, the Christ. But He is dead. And now to confuse them more, they hear some women who are claiming that He has risen from the dead. Even His closest followers, Peter and John, went to the tomb and found it empty. They don't know what to make of this, they are confused. They feel defeated, their hope gone.

Then Jesus started to walk with them. He explained the Scriptures, the Word of God, how the Messiah would first suffer and then enter into His Glory. So often, we walk along the road of our lives confused. We have difficulty solving our problems. We doubt our own ability to come up with the answers we need. Sometimes we look into ourselves for the answers, pretending to know everything. It is true that God gave us knowledge, but it is also true that we need God and His Spirit in our lives to help us understand Him and our life. Jesus led the disciples on the road to Emmaus to the Truth by explaining to them what is written in the Sacred Scriptures. On their own, they had failed to understand the meaning and implications of the Word God revealed to us in the Scriptures. Then, those disciples finally recognized Jesus in the Breaking of the Bread. They said to each other, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?"

We may not have the answers to the profound questions of life, or even to the daily concerns of life, but we do know where peace is found. In Jesus, the risen Christ. In Him alone we find our joy. We cannot understand Him sometimes, as the disciples on the road to Emmaus, but He will always walk side by side with us explaining to us the meaning of all that is going on in our life.

Those disciples who had this marvelous encounter with Christ ran back to Jerusalem, to Peter and the other disciples, and told them what they experienced. That was their joy that they could not keep this wonderful experience to themselves but share it with their friends.

The disciples could not keep their experience of the Risen Lord to themselves. Nor can we. We do not have to go knocking on peoples' doors, no, but we can be witnesses of this new life in Christ right in the places where we are. Places of work, in schools for students, in our homes with family members.

We have read in the First Reading, that Peter and the other Apostles, after encountering the Risen Lord, they proclaimed this Good News to their fellow Jewish people. We need not be so bold as Peter and his friends in their preaching, but we can show our faith in the Risen Christ by living as good disciples, that our way of life expresses our Christian faith. Peter told the Jewish people that he and the others were witnesses to the resurrection of the Lord and that they have to make it known to all peoples so that all may repent and obtain salvation through Jesus.

We also, like Peter and other apostles, are called to continue this witness, this apostolic witness in the world. Jesus came to transform the World through His death and resurrection, and we are part of that transformation because of our faith, therefore, we are called upon to continue working for this transformation, to change the World, that everyone will come to know and believe in Jesus and His teachings.

Total Income: \$113,751
Total Expenses: \$128,950
Income - Expenses: -\$15,199

Total Offertory & Debt Reduction Budget: \$118,667
Total Offertory & Debt Reduction Income: \$105,966
Difference: \$12,701

As we reach the end of February, our Total Offertory & Debt Reduction Income was \$12,701 Less Than our planned budget. Subsequently, when you look at total income versus total expenses, we are in the Negative by \$15,199. This continued deficit in income is very concerning since it forces us to continue to reach into our savings account to pay our bills so we can keep the Parish operational. We are respectfully requesting an increase in Parishioner offertory support. Thank you for your continued support of our Parish!




