

# Father Gerry's Homily:

This Sunday we celebrate the solemn feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus, "Corpus Christi". We celebrate it in gratitude for the precious gift of Jesus to us His followers: His Body and Blood. This celebration reminds us of the abiding presence of Jesus within us. As we celebrate Corpus Christi, we are invited to make real the sacrifice of Jesus for our salvation. Jesus Himself told us: "Do this in memory of me." Therefore, whenever we celebrate the Eucharist, we are reminded of His suffering, death, and resurrection.

The feast we celebrate today, provides us the opportunity to discover at a deeper level the reality of our faith in Jesus Christ who offered Himself for the salvation of humanity. In the Eucharist we receive the very Body and the Blood of Christ. And by receiving this divine gift, we enter in a special relationship with Jesus Christ. We become one with Jesus and are challenged to live our lives continually growing ever more in likeness of Him we believe, receive, and follow.

Jesus says in the Gospel of this Sunday: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." As we listen to these words, we are invited to practice this very action of Jesus: to give ourselves for the life of others. To be the source of life and goodness by our love and compassion to others. Because as we are nourished by Our Lord's Body and Blood, uniting us in a special bond with Him, we are called to respond similarly by nourishing others as Jesus nourishes us with His life, presence, and love.

As Jesus continues to give Himself as food and drink to us. He also continues to invite His followers to take our stand with Him, to hold to all He stands for, live by His values, and walk in His footsteps. Whenever we receive the holy Eucharist, we say our Amen to the Lord. We are acknowledging Him as our bread of life. We pledge ourselves to follow in His way and be faithful to Him as He is ever faithful to us. In that sense, celebrating Eucharist is not something to do lightly.

We should, therefore, truly appreciate and understand what Jesus is giving us in the Eucharist and its meaning in our life as Christians. If The Eucharist is the greatest gift of Jesus and a sign of His love for us, then, we who receive it, are supposed to make that unselfish love the central feature of our own lives. In other words, we must by all means reverence this Sacrament and receive it with great devotion, and more importantly conduct our lives according to what we receive. Because if we receive the Body and Blood of the Lord and continue to be self-centered and insensitive towards the needs of others, we will be contradicting what the Eucharist stands for.

When we say Amen as we receive the Body and Blood of Jesus, we confirm our faith in the Lord and stating that we know what we are receiving: Jesus Himself. We confirm our commitment to follow the Lord in His action of un-selfish love for other. For it is precisely that dedication to unselfishness in all we do that will enable us to make the Eucharist useful in our lives and make us to be the bread of life to others.

# **Eucharistic Revival**

The USA Bishops Conference announced a three-year initiative that aims to inspire, educate, and unite. In a World where not many people know Jesus intimately, the revival is meant to show everyone what wonders the True Presence of Jesus in The Eucharist can do to heal the soul.

From June 1, 2023, to July 17, 2024, it is the year of Parish Revival. This phase will foster Eucharistic devotion at parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching and organic movements as guided by the Holy Spirit. Each member of the faithful is invited to experience the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

# FdS Parish Financial Report (Through the end of April 2023) Fiscal Year 2022-2023

Total Income: \$152,362
Total Expenses: \$159,281
Income - Expenses: -\$6,919

Total Offertory & Debt Reduction Budget: \$148,333
Total Offertory & Debt Reduction Income: \$142,323
Difference: -\$6,010

As we reached the end of April, our combined Total Offertory & Debt Reduction Income was \$6,010 Less Than our planned budget. While there was a slight increase in regular offertory to date, our Mortgage Reduction Income was \$6,685 Less Than our required budget. Subsequently, when you look at total income versus total expenses, we are in the Negative by \$6,919. This continued deficit in income is very concerning since it forces us to continue to reach into our savings account to pay our bills so we can keep the Parish operational. We are respectfully requesting an increase in Parishioner offertory support. Thank you for your continued support of our Parish!

Please continue to contribute to our parish on a weekly or monthly basis. The following are ways to continue your financial support to Church of Francis de Sales:

- 1. When attending Sunday Mass, you can leave your Sunday Offertory in the tall basket on the table by the Baptismal Font.
- 2. You can bring your Sunday Offering [i.e., envelopes, check, cash] to the Parish Office [Monday & Tuesday 08:00am to 04:00pm and Friday 08:00am to 12:00 noon].
- 3. You can send cash or checks to the Parish Office for each week.
- 4. If you pay bills online, please consider making your weekly/monthly Offertory an online payment or set up automatic bill pay.


