

Happy Advent? Don't Celebrate Yet!

Welcome to the season of Advent and the beginning of the Church's liturgical year! Advent (from, "ad-venire" in Latin or "to come to") encompasses the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

People have anticipated Jesus' return since the earliest days of the Church; however, our readings during this season remind us to *be prepared* for His second coming rather than focus on *when* He is coming. We will be reminded of our obligation to prepare for Christ's coming by Fr. Koo's purple vestments, but Advent is not entirely a penitential season like Lent. While many of us go back to our childhood days and remember Advent as a waiting period for Christmas, it is more of an opportunity to change our ways and start over—read: repent! Consider it time to get off the naughty list and start getting onto the nice. This is a time to prepare, quiet, and discipline our hearts for the full joy of Christmas. We will offer an Advent Penitential Liturgy at our Church of Francis de Sales on *Wednesday, December 20th*.

If we are seeking ways to be inspired to change our ways during Advent, we need look no further than the great saints that fill the calendar this season. In this month we meet the real Santa Claus, a missionary priest, doctor of the Church, visionary, bishop, pope, and a martyr. We also have two of Marian feasts (including the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th, a holyday of obligation).

Each week of Advent has a theme (as does every week in our liturgical calendar). The first week's theme is hope, the second week's is peace, the third is joy (when the liturgical color is rose, which indicates joy), and the fourth week's theme is love. These colors and themes are carried over to the candles of the Advent wreath and the prayers that we say when each of the candles is lit.

Contrary to TV ads that tell us we are in the "Christmas season," our liturgical season of Christmas does not begin until the vigil masses of Christmas Eve and ends, this year, after the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord on Monday, January 9th. If you are looking for an excuse to leave your Christmas decorations up longer, like we do in our home, you can go "old school" and wait until Candlemas (The Presentation of the Lord) which occurs this year on Friday, February 2nd.

We find ourselves getting all wrapped up in the hectic activities of the secular "silly season." Each of us can make some time early each day, or at some time with our family, to find a different rhythm in our lives by allowing this Advent season to help renew our desire for His coming and be prepared for Him whenever it may be.


