

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

The first reading today foreshadows what Jesus will so memorably do centuries later. Elisha insists that twenty small barley loaves, given as an offering to God, would feed a hundred people with some left over. Jesus tells His disciples the same thing when all they could offer to the thousands of pilgrims who gather to see Him are five barley loaves and two fish. God nourishes and sustains us always, no matter how impossible it seems.



This weekend we will be installing our new Tabernacle temporarily in the Sanctuary. We as a Parish are being blest to have the Eucharist in our Church proper. There are some respectful traditios which are required of us as faithful Catholics to demonstrate our knowledge and awareness of the Eucharist in our midst.

Upon entering the Church and arriving at the desired pew one should genuflect. This is an outward sign designed to show our reverence for the Body of Christ present in the Tabernacle. As Catholics we believe Jesus Christ is present Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Consecrated Bread. As such we are asked to show our respect and honor for the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We also genufle t upon leaving our pew after Mass. Again we are called to reverence Jesus present in the Eucharist. We can turn our eyes and focus on the Tabernacle thanking Jesus for His great love for us as well as His presence in our midst.

A lit candle will be present on the wall next to the Tabernacle. This is called the Sanctuary Lamp and when lit it signifie the presence of Jesus in the Tabernacle. Whenever we see the candle glowing red we can be assured Jesus is present.

Many people come to Church early to pray and prepare for the sacrifice of the Mass. To respect our fellow parishioners and also create an atmosphere of quiet reverence there should be no talking in the church before Mass. If a parishioner needs to speak and have conversation the commons area would be the appropriate place to do so. Ushers will alert you as to whe Mass is starting so you can come into the Church to attend Mass.

The presence of Jesus in the Sanctuary is a blessing for us all. When we partake in Christ in the Eucharist we are receiving the greatest gift God can offe — the gift of God's very self. May we honor and cherish our Lord in His gift of Himself to us.






