



#### Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word:

In Moses' time, the Lord God sent bread from heaven in the form of manna, which sustained the Chosen People on their lengthy and difficult journey across the desert. Centuries later, God sent the Son, the Bread of Life, who nourishes us now on our journey to God's kingdom. On our journeys, may we keep in mind that we are called to leave behind our old corrupted, sinful self and "put on the new self," as Saint Paul wrote, our true self that is founded in Jesus.



This weekend we will be installing our new Tabernacle temporarily in the Sanctuary. We as a Parish are being blest to have the Eucharist in our Church proper. There are some respectful traditions which are required of us as faithful Catholics to demonstrate our knowledge and awareness of the Eucharist in our midst.

Upon entering the Church and arriving at the desired pew one should genuflect. This is an outward sign designed to show our reverence for the Body of Christ present in the Tabernacle. As Catholics we believe Jesus Christ is present Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Consecrated Bread. As such we are asked to show our respect and honor for the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We also genuflect upon leaving our pew after Mass. Again we are called to reverence Jesus present in the Eucharist. We can turn our eyes and focus on the Tabernacle thanking Jesus for His great love for us as well as His presence in our midst.

A lit candle will be present on the wall next to the Tabernacle. This is called the Sanctuary Lamp and when lit it signifies the presence of Jesus in the Tabernacle. Whenever we see the candle glowing red we can be assured Jesus is present.

Many people come to Church early to pray and prepare for the sacrifice of the Mass. To respect our fellow parishioners and also create an atmosphere of quiet reverence there should be no talking in the church before Mass. If a parishioner needs to speak and have conversation the commons area would be the appropriate place to do so. Ushers will alert you as to when Mass is starting so you can come into the Church to attend Mass.

The presence of Jesus in the Sanctuary is a blessing for us all. When we partake in Christ in the Eucharist we are receiving the greatest gift God can offer – the gift of God's very self. May we honor and cherish our Lord in His gift of Himself to us.




