Gospel: Luke 22:14-23:56: The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We sing some of the saddest words in all of scripture in the psalm today: "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" Isaiah resisted this despair as he was struck and spat at, professing his confidence in God. Paul testifies that Jesus was willing to empty Himself, to humble Himself, accepting even death on a cross. In the Passion, we hear Jesus pray to the Father, "not my will but yours." May today's readings reassure us that even in our worst despair God will never truly abandon us.

Journey Through the Bible: In The Beginning (The Gospel According to Saint John)

This commentary is adapted from Little Rock Scripture Study's "The Gospel According to John"

The Gospel of John begins with a magnificent prologue which proclaims Jesus as the preexistent and incarnate Word of God who has revealed the Father to us. The phrase "In the beginning" in verse one of the prologue echoes Genesis 1:1 and alerts the reader to the new creation theme present in the Gospel. The "Word" (*Logos*) is present in the Old Testament as the creative energy of God, as in Genesis 1 and Isaiah 55. The Greek term *logos*, a widely used philosophical term meaning "order," "reason," or "harmony," was chosen to express this aspect of God. The *Logos* in John is the one through whom all things have been created and who was with God and turned toward God even before Creation, a statement that what God was, the *Logos* also was.

In the first few verses of Genesis, we hear of a mighty wind sweeping over the abyss, and then God brings light into creation. A strong wind is also mentioned in The Walking on the Water narrative in the Gospel of John. The Apostles have rowed about three or four miles in a stirred up sea when they saw Jesus walking on the sea. As Jesus came near the boat, they began to be afraid. But he said to them, "It is I. Do not be afraid." (John 6:20)

Jesus' words, "It is I," represent the Greek phrase *ego eimi*, which in other contexts can be translated "I am." These words echo God's self-identification as "I AM WHO I AM" (Exodus 3:14) and indicate Jesus' divinity. Immediately after this episode of calming a stormy sea, Jesus institutes The Eucharist with the Bread of Life Discourse, saying, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst" (John 6:35) and "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life." (John 6:54)

The Gospel of John records several other occasions when Jesus describes who he is, among them: "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12), "I am the gate for the sheep" (John 10:7), "I am the good shepherd" (John 10:11), "I am the resurrection and the life" (John 11:25), "I am the way and the life and the truth" (John 14:6) and "I am the vine, you are the branches." (John 15:5)

On Holy Thursday, Father Koo will wash the feet of twelve parishioners, as Jesus did for the Apostles in John's account of the Last Supper. As teacher and lord, Jesus was willing to wash the feet of his disciples; they should be willing to do the same for one another. Here is a model of not only humble and loving service, but self-sacrificing love. We, too, ought to follow the model.




